Round the world with Jessica Watson



On 15th May 2010, a sixteen-year-old girl called Jessica Watson completed the final part of a 42,500 kilometre journey. More than 75,000 people were waiting for her as she sailed her 10-metre pink yacht, Ella's Pink Lady, into Sydney Harbour in Australia. When they saw her arrive they all waved. Jessica is a national hero in Australia, as she is the youngest person to sail around the world non-stop and unassisted (without help). Her journey took 210 days, and during the trip, Jessica had some scary experiences and sailed her boat through several storms.

Jessica had already done a lot of preparation before her journey began in October 2009. She had taken courses in sailing, radio operating, engine maintenance and first aid, so she knew how to look after the boat and herself. She had worked on other boats and she had already sailed over 18,000 kilometres. But in September 2009, just before her

journey began, Jessica had a bad sailing accident. She was sailing from Brisbane to Sydney when her boat crashed into a huge ship. The crash was at two o'clock in the morning and Jessica had fallen asleep. Fortunately she wasn't injured and she managed to fix the boat before she began her journey around the world on 18th October.

The journey was non-stop, and so Jessica didn't stop at any ports for 7 months. The boat carried everything that Jessica needed for the whole journey, including 160 cartons of juice, 64 tins of tuna and 576 chocolate bars!

The prime minister of Australia was with the thousands of people at Sydney Harbour to welcome Jessica home. He said 'You are a hero for all Australian people – for all Australian women.' He also gave her a special prize – some free driving lessons. Even though Jessica is a fantastic sailor, she can't drive!!
